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PERSONAL AND CAREER JOURNEY

Gail began her career as an Occupational Therapist in 1999 after graduating from Glasgow Caledonian University and spent 3 years across central Scotland before working as Specialist Occupational Therapist within South Lanarkshire.

During her time in South Lanarkshire, Gail was responsible for the design and establishment of community rehabilitation services for clients with traumatic brain injury. She was also instrumental in the development of the vibrant Headway South Lanarkshire support service and successfully obtained funding for this service through various funding streams to provide residential activity holidays for service users and to employ a service coordinator.

In 2008/2009, Gail undertook a Post Graduate Certificate in Brain Injury Rehabilitation through Queen Margaret University and the Scottish Neurorehabilitation Service at Astley Ainslie Hospital, Edinburgh. This allowed her to add further to her existing treatment skills before then moving to the North East of England and joining the Neural Pathways team.

Gail has a specific interest in the rehabilitation of clients with severe challenging behaviours and vocational rehabilitation and has experience of working with adults and children.
